Greens report:

The green never did fully recover from the damage done to it by an unusually severe winter last year, despite various extensive remedial efforts attempted during the season. As a consequence, the decision was made to close it a week earlier than normal hopefully to allow the required maintenance to be done under better weather conditions, which indeed proved to be the case. We were able to complete the aeration and core removal on the morning of September 26th and allow the green to dry before applying 5 yards of sand the next morning, which was also allowed to dry before being extensively dragged and spread to fill in the holes created by the previous aeration. Finally, the following day the green was over-seeded and extensively watered to wash everything in, and this final part of the 3 day process was helped by rain showers over the next couple of days. This was followed by a return to nice warm daytime temperatures, all of which has combined to give the green the best possible chance of making a complete recovery prior to next season.

Since closing the green, much work has been done to it, including weekly mowing, fungicidal and fertilizer applications, repairs to the plinths and surrounds and the building up of the low areas around the perimeters.

A new Turf Manager was recently appointed by the City, and initial indications are that the club will enjoy a beneficial relationship with him. Work has been done to rectify the drainage problem on the park side of the green, our second mower has been delivered and discussions have commenced regarding replacement of the boards, plinths and caps on all 4 sides of the green. While this might have to be done over an extended period of time, it is work which is better done by the City rather than our Green's crew.

We had great turnouts at the two closing work parties also, and everything went well moving a lot of stuff around as required. We have managed to get rid of our older, no longer usable equipment and things appear to be in good order on all fronts as we look forward to our new season next April.

Vern has agreed to take over Green's Warden duties and has already been instrumental in both doing and overseeing most of the work which has taken place over the last month since the green closed.

My thanks to those who have been part of the regular greens and surrounds crew during the past season, and to all who participated in the greens closing work parties. Your help was greatly appreciated, as will be your on-going participation. Archie
